Brief Biography of Speakers

- **George Howell**

Manager of Public Security Policy, The Senlis Council

George Howell is manager of The Senlis Council's international Centre of Excellence on Public Security, based in Rio de Janeiro. Mr Howell has conducted extensive research into public security issues in South America, and is involved in public security advocacy, consultancy, and network building. Mr Howell holds a BA in Social Anthropology and a Masters of Science in Development Studies from the School of Oriental and African Studies of the University of London.

- **Raymond Kendall**

Former Secretary General of Interpol, Senior Advisor to The Senlis Council

After serving in the British Air Force, Raymond Kendall studied modern languages at Oxford University. In 1962, he entered Scotland Yard and 9 years later joined Interpol. From 1985 until its reform in 2001, Mr Kendall served as elected Secretary-General of the organisation.

- **Craig Mitchell**

Senior Superintendent, National Strategic Management South African Police Service – South Africa

Senior Superintendent Craig Mitchell joined the South African Police Service (SAPS) in February 1986 and has 22 years' service, having served at station level, provincial level and at the national SAPS Head Office, where he has been stationed for the past 8 years within the national Strategic Management Component. He holds a Baccalaureus Technologiae degree in Policing (cum laude) and is a qualified Ethics Officer. Senior Superintendent Mitchell has been involved in the development of the SAPS Strategic Plan and Annual Performance Plan for the past five years. He is responsible for the development of operational and support strategies within the SAPS, such as the risk management strategy and the corruption and fraud prevention strategy, which facilitate the implementation of the South African Police Service's Strategic Plan.



○ **Francis Mugizi**

Secretary, National Security Committee, Office of the President – Republic of Uganda

Francis Mugizi is a lawyer by profession, having graduated in 1982 from Makerere University, Kampala, and entering into law practice 1983, when he joined the Law Development Centre, Kampala. From 1985-1986, Mr Mugizi worked at the Ministry of Education. He has been at the Office of the President since 1986, for which he became acting Secretary of the National Security Committee in 2002. Mr Mugizi is also Secretary for the Joint Intelligence Committee of Uganda.

○ **Felisberto Njele**

Member of the Executive Council, Director of Central Africa Desk, Centre of Strategic Studies of Angola

General Felisberto Njele currently sits on the Executive Council of the Centre of Strategic Studies of Angola, where he has been Director of the Central Africa desk between since 2005. Prior to this position, General Njele was Director of Operations of the Electoral Technical Consortium. General Njele entered the Armed Forces of Angola in 1975, rising to the rank of National Commander of Special Forces by 1986. Before retiring from the Armed Forces in 2002, General Njele served as Deputy Director of the Mindef Military Intelligence Services.

○ **Rodrigo Oliveira**

Director of the Coordination Body of Special Resources, Rio de Janeiro Civil Police - Brazil

As first category *delegado* (police chief) for the Rio de Janeiro Civil Police, Rodrigo Oliveira currently coordinates the Special Resources Department (CORE), a Civil Police special unit. Mr Oliveira has been twice elected director of CORE, as well as the post of director of the Planning and Police Operations Department (DEPOP). Known for leading his men in tactical operations in the field, *Delegado* Oliveira lead a Brazilian team to Haiti on the UN peace mission. This was the first time that the UN had invited a Brazilian police division to participate in an international mission.



○ **Nickson Olwa**

Operations Officer, Conflict Early Warning and Early Response Unit, Uganda Focal Point on Small Arms and Light Weapons, Ministry of Internal Affairs - Republic of Uganda

Since April 2006, Nickson Olwa has been responsible for coordinating and supervising all activity related to conflict early warning and early response, in his role Operations Officer for the Uganda Focal Point on Small Arms and Light Weapons. Mr Olwa underwent police training and subsequently joined the Ugandan Police Force as Cadet Assistant Superintendent of Police Induction Training in 1993. Between 2001 and his current position, Mr Olwa worked as a Research Officer at Uganda Police Headquarters, undertaking research and strategic plans for the police service.

○ **Emmanuel Reinert**

Executive Director, The Senlis Council

In his role as Executive Director, for the past five years Mr. Reinert has led international campaigns focusing on counter-narcotics and security issues and provided innovative analysis on these topics. Within his work for The Senlis Council, Mr Reinert has been pivotal in establishing its European network, developing the Council's Poppy for Medicine initiative which was officially endorsed by the European Parliament in 2007, and setting up its work in Brazil on public security. Mr Reinert's expertise on counter-narcotics and security issues has put him in a position to give several keynote addresses to prestigious international security conferences. He has also conducted interviews with major international media such as BBC, CNN and Al Jazeera.

○ **Daniel Meireles da Rocha**

Legal Assessor, Department of Policy, Programmes and Projects, National Public Security Secretariat, Ministry of Justice – Brazil

Daniel da Rocha was born in the state of Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil. He is a lawyer, having graduated in Public International Law from the University of the Region of Campanha/RS in 2002/2003, and in Constitutional Law in 2004 and Penal Law in 2005, both from the Processus Institut - Brasilia DF.



Da Rocha has practiced criminal law since 1997. In March of 2003, he joined the Ministry of Justice as a legal assessor, where he worked closely with the Department of Foreign Affairs and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) to develop the Project of Consolidation and Qualification of Policies on Migration and International Agreements. In 2007, he joined the National Public Security Secretariat of the Ministry of Justice, as Legal Assessor for the Policy, Programme and Project Department. Da Rocha works on the team responsible for creating and developing PRONASCI, the National Public Security Programme with Citizenship.

○ **Sergio Sirino**

Coordinator, Narcotics Division (DENARC), Paraná Civil Police - Brazil

Sergio Sirino is a *delegado* (police chief) in Curitiba, capital of the Brazilian state of Paraná, and Coordinator of the state Narcotics Division (DENARC). Mr Sirino also coordinates the Nucleus of Repression of Economic Crimes (NURCE), developing important work to combat white collar crimes. Under his management, NURCE solved an infamous case last year, in which hackers were diverting money from bank accounts. The case resulted in 33 imprisonments and 36 search warrants. Mr Sirino holds a Masters in Criminology from Coimbra University in Portugal and teaches at the Civil Police Academy. He has a published book about Police Investigations.

○ **Sandra Valle**

Senior Interregional Adviser (Latin America, Africa and the European Union), United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime

Sandra Valle joined the UNODC in September 1999, as Senior Interregional Adviser. From February 2000 to January 2002, she held the position of Chief of Staff of UNODC (then ODCCP). Presently, Ms Valle has resumed her position of Senior Interregional Adviser, providing technical assistance and advisory services on trafficking in human beings, criminal justice reform, and drafting legislation to comply with the UN conventions related to organized crime, corruption and terrorism to several countries. At the beginning of 2008, Ms Valle was posted for three months in Guinea Bissau. Prior to joining the United Nations, Ms Valle was National Secretary of Justice in Brazil from 1995 to 1999. She has represented Brazil in multilateral organisations and in bilateral meetings with high-level officials.
